









Coleman Island Trail Action Items


- Acquire Bridge & Earthen Track Property
 - Note most of Trail is on MM property
- Complete Conceptual Design of Trail & Workers' Staircase Area

Present to Public and Clear any Concerns

Confirm Budget including necessary Fund-Raising

Potential for Exciting Trail Network

- OVRT/CPR, Coleman Island and existing Riverwalk Trails are complementary, providing:
 - Significant Trail Network
 - Greatly extended 3 km length
 - Wonderful River Views
- Trails can be linked in various ways to form several interconnected and interesting Loops
- This is a very exciting opportunity



New Projects are 'Positioned Well to Progress'

- Coleman Island Trail (CIT) will be on MM or MRPC Property
- Much of the Workers' Walk part of the CIT has been cleared 'pro bono'
- The Conceptual Design for the CIT is complete, but Staircase Design is needed
- The CPR Trail (now OVRT) will be owned by the County, which will cover much of its cost
- The CPR Trail (Main St to Carss St) already completed, substantially and pro bono, as a Stone Dust Path

Fundraising

- Project will have to completed in Parts: path, staircase, etc
- Fundraising will address each Part need funds to start!
- Funding to include, \$ donations, grants, taxes, memorial trees & benches, in-kind help, other
- \$ Donations are critical to get project started, to substantiate grants and MM funding
- Note Well: MM will match \$ Donations and will provide a tax receipt for donations over \$20.00
- It is essential that ~\$12,000 is raised for staircase design ASAP; \$6,000 in donations is needed now
