#### D. DELEGATIONS/PRESENTATIONS

Wild Parsnip Management
 Abby Armstrong, Environmental Compliance Coordinator

The Environmental Compliance Coordinator provided an overview of the proposed 2020 Wild Parsnip as well as the 2018 and 2019 initiatives regarding Wild Parsnip. Other items highlighted included: the 2020 proposed map for spraying; overview of previous years; methodology; changes to the plan; opt-out, adopt a road and the pollinator pilot project.

#### E. NEW BUSINESS

1. Wild Parsnip Management

The Committee discussed potential impacts of spot spraying or boom spraying within the buffer of certified organic farms. Spraying of any kind within an 8-meter buffer of an organic farm is not tolerated.

Alternative options discussed included:

- Pollinator plan project (long term solution)
- Mowing makes little impact on eradicating the infestation but impedes its growth (would be ongoing solution)
- Ditches made more ready to allow farmers to be able to access the ditches to mow
- Reverting to mechanical controls in organic farms
- Manual removal by summer students
- Increased ditching in-front of organic farm operations

Members discussed the potential cost of mechanically removing wild parsnip in the ditches in front of organic farming operations; spraying near waterways, contacting organic farmers regarding the mapping; Clayton Lake Road; including mapping of where Lanark County spraying will occur on County Roads within Mississippi Mills, and costing of mechanical removal (hand removal).

The Committee recessed at 1:39 p.m. and resumed at 1:50 p.m.

**THAT** the Agriculture Advisory Committee recommend that Council authorize members of the Agriculture Advisory Committee to communicate directly with identified organic farmers in Mississippi Mills regarding proposed wild parsnip management options as well as mapping information;

**AND THAT** the Agriculture Advisory Committee recommend that Council authorize the Agriculture Advisory Committee to submit comments directly to the Environmental Compliance Coordinator regarding preferred methods of wild parsnip management on land directly abutting organic farming operations.
