#### I. OTHER/NEW BUSINESS

1. YTD Financial report

Clerk will bring forward request for increase to the Association and Convention line of the 2019 draft budget to support additional training opportunities.

2. Rash of Break and Enters according to social media – do stats reflect?

S/Sgt McConnell indicated that the stats ending June 30, 2018 did not reflect a rash of break and enter. He will provide members with year-to-date statistics ending August 30, 2018.

3. Update on status of Highway 7 report from MTO

Topic was not discussed at AMO. Councillor Ferguson to follow up with MPP Randy Hillier and the Minister of Transportation.

4. Update on initiatives for Proceeds of Crime Grant

Morgan Crew, a Lanark County Mental Health Professional, hired to co-ordinate police and medical requirements and resources for persons in distress. S/Sgt McConnell reported there have been very positive results.

5. Policing of the Ottawa Valley Rail Trail -overview of OPP authority on trail

S/Sgt McConnell to provide information on the Off Road Motor Vehicle Act and ATV Club monitoring of trails.

County Council to receive the draft management plan for the OVRT on September 26<sup>th</sup> which provides the rules for users and the monitoring plan.

6. OPP readiness for cannabis legalization –overview of programs in place

S/Sgt McConnell advised that several officers have been trained on Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs) and they have access to Drug Recognition Experts (DREs). Challenges presented by the legalization will be addressed as they arise and dealt with under various federal and provincial acts.

7. Speed Monitoring System

Councillor Torrance raised the possibility of installing a speed monitoring system in Appleton with our without community involvement for funding. S/Sgt McConnell supported the signs stating they are effective reducing speed in trouble areas.

# Moved by Councillor Torrance Seconded by Anne Mason

**THAT** the Community Policy Advisory Committee recommends that Council consider the development of a speed monitoring program and the inclusion of funds to purchase a speed sign monitoring system at an approximate cost of \$5,000 in the 2019 budget.

# ONTARIO ASSICIATION OF POLICE SERVICES BOARDS (OAPSB) ZONE 2 – EASTERN ONTARIO REGION MEETING

#### **MINUTES**

The Fall Meeting of the OAPSB Zone 2 was held on Friday, November 30, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. at the Belleville Public Library hosted by the Belleville Police Services Board.

### 1. Meeting Call to Order

Chairperson Neil Fennell called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m.

#### 2. Chair's Welcome & Opening Remarks

Chairperson Fennell introduced himself and welcomed everyone to the meeting. He offered thanks to the Belleville Police Services Board and Belleville Police Service for their efforts in organizing and hosting the meeting. He offered a special thanks to Susan Boyle, Secretary to the Belleville Police Services Board who is responsible for the success of the meeting. He called on Mayor Taso Christopher to bring greetings.

Mayor Taso Christopher welcomed the Zone members and brought greetings on behalf of his Board and Council. He then:

- highlighted some of the City's achievements such as the new casino, bridge and the Belleville Senators hockey team;
- thanked the Zone 2 for allowing Belleville to host the meeting;
- thanked his PSB's Vice Chairperson and Susan Boyle, Board Secretary
- brought regrets on behalf of the other members of the Board who were unable to attend the meeting
- recognized his Chief and Deputy Chief of Police

He highlighted the City's goal to become the safest City in the Province of Ontario. He encouraged members to stay for the hockey game that evening and to visit the casino.

Mayor Jim Harrison, Quinte West thanked Mayor Christopher for his service and their great working relationship.

# 5. Business Arising from the Minutes

### 6. Delegations

### a) A/Director Paul Hebert, Ontario Police College

A/Director Hebert provided gave an overview of his background and provided an update on the following matters:

- Reviewed the history of the Ontario Police College since 1942
- Showed the College's crest signifying Integrity, Knowledge, Courage
- Reviewed the College's statistics there have been 44,891 recruits since 1962
  - o Average age of students is 27
  - o 2017 900 students; 2018 1400 students
  - 50% of students have a college diploma; 48% university degree and 2% college/university
  - o 21% female; 79% male
- A memorial garden was built in memorial of 9-11
- Reviewed the College's organizational chart and how it reports into the Province and the Assistant Deputy Minister and staffing (40 full time and 45 seconded professors from government, OPP and municipal Police Services)
- Reviewed the clientele who attend the College; all new recruits attend the College
- Reviewed the courses offered at the College through 3 intakes each year with 480 recruits / intake
- The authority for the College is provided under the Police Services Act
- Reviewed the threads of the Basic Training Program

- Drug Impaired Driving Initiative Overview. The College needs to work with the OPP and the government to look at doing the 1 week of Drug Recognition training (currently completed in the USA) in Canada
- Reviewed the facilities at the College and invited people to attend for a visit
- The College works with its partners to revamp courses to ensure they are working with the legislation in the field
- They are looking for consistency across the Province and eventually across the country to ensure consistency in how cases are dealt with

After all questions had been addressed, Chairperson Fennell thanked A/Director Hebert for his presentation.

A recess was called at 10:20 a.m. and the meeting resumed at 10:35 a.m.

# b) Jeff McGuire, Executive Director, Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police (OACP)

Mr. McGuire's presentation included information on the following matters:

- Data analysis summary results of the Constable Selection System (CSS)
- The vision and mission of the OACP
- The Association has 1300 members; more than 300 people work on Committees who are not members of the organization as they are not eligible
- The CSS was developed in 1998 and has been the standardized selection system used across the province. When a candidate has completed the testing, they receive a certificate which they provide to the Police Service they wish to join. The testing is not mandated
- An Applicant Testing Service does the CSS training under contract with the OACP and they have 18 years of data
- A working group of the OACP is reviewing the CSS. A survey of testing participants is issued following the testing and receives a 63% response rate. Survey results indicate:
  - Trend is that male/female applicants have been declined in the past 5 years
  - Average age is 27.2 years
  - The level of education has increased
  - 84% of certificate recipients received 1 certificate; 16% received 2 certificates
  - The Physical Readiness for Police certificate had an 84% pass rate (53% women; 90% men)
  - o The Political Analytical Thinking Inventory (PATI) had a 64% pass rate
  - The Written Communications Test had a 62% pass rate
- The cost for the testing is minimal at \$350.53 if a candidate passes everything the first time which is 56.5% of applicants
- The OACP is working hard to make testing changes
- All 50 Police Services responded to the survey. 95% agreed that a baseline standard is required for policing

After all questions had been addressed, Chairperson Fennell thanked Mr. McGuire for his presentation.

# c) Chief Ron Gignac and Deputy Chief Michael Callahan, Belleville Police Service

Chief Ron Gignac spoke about choosing what is important to a community and following it. He spoke about determining the standard you want, communicating it and then implementing it. What you say must be aligned with what you do.

Deputy Chief Callahan highlighted some matters of interest to the Belleville Police Service including:

- Contract Policing a different way of hiring police officers. Look at performance standards. Modeled after the military. Offer 4 years, following by an additional 4 years. If not meeting the performance standards after 4 years, do not renew contract.
- ii. New Police Service Facility a hybrid building which will provide an additional 32,000 square feet of space and which is expected to open in April-May 2020
- iii. Cop Shop Program sponsored by local mall owners. It engages local youth 6-11 years. The local Dodge dealership offers 6 vehicles which pick up youth at school, takes them for a free lunch and offers \$250 in gift certificates for youth to shop at the mall
- iv. Civil Litigation Liaison Officer started in Ottawa. Results in face to face discussions to settle pending lawsuits and results in significant cost savings
- v. Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder / Physical Injuries partner with Wounded Warriors Canada. Municipal governments, police services, fire departments and ambulance participate in the program which provides national experts in the medical field which offers services to members and their spouses
- vi. Shared Services Opportunities with Other Departments including training, education, shared emergency communication, etc.

After all questions had been addressed, Chairperson Fennell thanked Chief Gignac and Deputy Chief Callahan for their presentation.

#### a) David Tilley, Police Services Advisory, Ministry of Community Safety & Correctional Services

Mr. Tilley provided information on the following issues:

- There is a new Minister of Community Safety Sylvia Jones, new Deputy Minister Mario Di Tommaso and a new OPP Commissioner Ron Taverner
- The new Safer Ontario Act is being planned to be enacted as the schedule. Some sections will take effect January 2019 with the remainder in January 2020
- With respect to Provincial Board appointments, there has been a transition period following the change in government and the recent change in Minister. Appointments and reappointments are now being reviewed by the Minister's Office and Orders in Council are now starting to be processed
- The RIDE grant and funding is continuing to flow as per the established schedule. All other grants are currently on hold pending the completion of the government's review of expenditures.

Chairperson Fennell thanked Mr. Tilley for his presentation.

### b) King Yee, OAPSB Zone 2 Director

Mr. Yee provided information on the following issues:

- Reviewed the 2018-2020 governance related mandate which includes consultation on the new regulations, obtaining input from Detachment Commanders and Boards, and Board evaluation and training systems
- He invited members to review the OAPSB members' section of the OAPSB website
- A catalogue of existing contracts in relation to the coordinated bargaining mandate can be found on the website
- In order to meet the competency objectives with respect to education and training under the Act, the OAPSB is waiting to receive information from the government with respect to funding to provide the training

Chairperson Fennell thanked Mr. Yee for his information.
